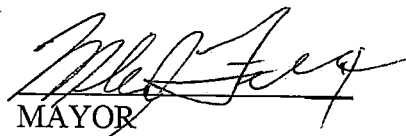

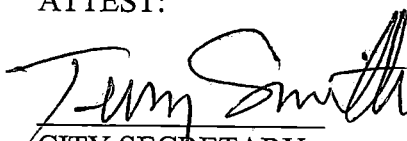
3. Adjourn:
